Jose L Merino is Director of the Arrhythmia and Robotic Electrophysiology Unit at La Paz University Hospital, Madrid, Spain. His main research interest is treatment of atrial and ventricular arrhythmias, and he has made more than 300 contributions as congress abstracts and has had more than 100 articles published in indexed journals, such as the New England Journal of Medicine and Circulation. His main contributions in this field have been for bundle branch reentry ventricular tachycardia and superior vena cava flutter. He is also involved in the development of new antiarrhythmic and anticoagulant drugs, electroanatomical mapping (EnSite™) and remote navigation systems (the Magnetecs Catheter Guidance Control and Imaging system, Amigo-Catheter Robotics) for electrophysiology.
